Researchers thought this method would work because the outer membranes of cancerous bladder cells contain a gateway for the coxsackievirus: a molecule called ICAM-1. Because healthy cells do not carry this molecule, the coxsackievirus does not attack them. Once the virus gets into the cell, it hijacks the cell's machinery and ends up killing it. Even more cancer cells die when the immune cells are recruited.
